

I would also like to say, "Hi" to the new volunteers that have joined the hatchery, and I'm looking forward to getting to know them better. On a more personal note, after four years of building a new home and doing the landscaping, I almost have my last big project completed. With the help of some of the hatchery labor pool and other friends, I was able to put up a 15' X 28" extension onto my shop. So now I'll be able to have all my "toys" under cover. So with that out of the way, I will finally have more time to devote to the hatchery.

General Meeting

Nov. 10, 2011

<u>David Sophusson</u>, president, called the meeting to order at 10:04 AM. The minutes of last month's meeting were approved as printed in *The Riffle*.

<u>Treasurer's report-</u> Hassie Taylor reported the monthly loss of \$474.09 and an end of month balance of \$25,095.06. Approximately \$1,700 was raised at the pizza fundraiser. There are still some outstanding, sizeable expenses for the fish derby.

<u>Volunteer Coordinator</u> Chris Underhill reported that there are several energetic new volunteers that are quickly getting involved. Chris visited the hatchery in Gardner to watch a spawning session and was very impressed by the innovations they've done at little cost and their involvement of local school children.

Christmas/election/appreciation meetingChris will call for volunteer helpers to set up the
Turtle Rock meeting room and she will use her
call list for the non-CAF volunteers. Shore Pines
assisted living chef will make some desserts.
The board allocated \$400 for the dinner,
including the rental fee. The board decided that
CAF will not provide alcohol to avoid liability
issues. There will be a raffle, volunteer
appreciation recognition, ODFW presentations
and board member election.

<u>Board member election-</u> There is one vacancy and one nominee. A list will be in *The Riffle* and nominations will be accepted from the floor. A ballot will be available, if needed. Hassie Taylor will leave the board and concentrate on *The Riffle* and other valuable volunteer contributions for the continuing success of CAF.

Hatchery- Gary Underhill reported that the tides and the rain brought many fish to the hatchery, but most have been very dark (dying). We have 55 females and 49 males at this point and we will spawn next week. The incubation room, spawning supplies and spawning crews are all ready. We may be able to complete the spawning in 4 consecutive weekly sessions. Gary has removed 6 rats from the building since last month.

<u>Information kiosk-</u> Jim Freedman is our representative on the Lower Rogue Watershed Council (LRWC) and reported on the kiosk across the street from the Indian Creek Café.

LRWC has replacement information panels and would like CAF's help in replacing the panels, cleaning up and painting the kiosk. John Weber stated that a STAC grant should be sought for monies to improve and repair the kiosk. The meeting was adjourned at 10:54 AM.

Salmon King of Oregon

Robert D. Hume - Part 2

At Ellensburg, Hume set to developing the fishery, controlling all aspects of its operation, from hatching to catching and canning to selling. He also understood that creating a monopoly would cut operational costs and increase profits, and he set this strategy in motion.

Meanwhile. Hume began his greatest work - the artificial propagation of salmon. experiments, although rudimentary, eventually proved that sustained conservation economic value. By 1893 this dedicated student of ichthyology wrote and published a booklet titled "Salmon of the Pacific Coast." He distributed copies to anyone interested in the subject. Today you can purchase the booklet from the Gold Beach Historical Society.

Always focused on his business interests, he accumulated large tracts of land, eventually owning more than 94,000 acres in Curry County, which included all tidelands along the Rogue. And he guarded his property ceaselessly.

He declared that anyone not employed by him had no right to fish on the land, that fishing was privately owned; and he defended his stance for 30 years.

Hume entered politics to defend his domain. In 1900, he was elected to the Oregon legislature. The enterprising capitalist's empire grew. His extensive cannery complex now included a sawmill, blacksmith shop, and a boat-building facility. He built a hotel, salon, and general store nearby. Providing merchandise and services allowed him to dominate the lower Rogue River economy. Mercantile trade was a core component of his operations. and he deliberately repossess aimed to every employee's wages and profit on the exchange. Townsfolk grew resentful of his dominance, nicknaming their employers "King Bob" and "Queen Mary."

I'd like to thank everyone for coming out and supporting CAF at the Sunset Pizza Fundraiser. It was nice seeing everyone and we sold more than 50 pizzas. We made \$112.00 on desserts made by our own CAF volunteers. Blueberry Delight sold out!

We've collected 55 females and 49 males from the hatchery ladder and Huntley Park for the spawning season. The food bank received 37 fish; Shore Pines received 4 fish. However, some fish were unusable.

We've had fish in the creek since Oct 4th, and there are at least 50 fish in the hole above the blocker dam. A lot of fish have come and passed by the hatchery this year. ODFW will, hopefully, give us some numbers at the party.

I'll be calling to personally invite everyone to the Christmas Party. If by chance I miss you, please feel free to call me. Let me know how many guests and what dish you are bringing to the potluck. If you'd like to help set-up or clean up after the party, call me 541 247-0396. Remember it's BYOB - Bring Your Own Booze this year, but we'll have lemonade and ham and turkey, unless I can somehow find some salmon fillets to BBQ. Does anyone have some salmon to donate?

We had the first day of spawning Nov. 15th. Thirteen pair of fish was spawned, so we are on our way. The daily feeder calendar will be starting up. Required information will be written on the board at hatchery. We had a great turnout of volunteers, and we picked up a few new volunteers. We will be spawning every Tuesday until all the fish are gone. So come on by and play with fish.

Hope everyone has a Happy Thanksgiving and a Merry Christmas. I hope to see you at a spawning and the Christmas party.

I grew up and lived in the Bellingham, WA area. Even when I was very young, I have always been mechanically inclined. When the boss found out that his head mechanic was calling me for advice, well... So I worked there for a short time as head mechanic until I found out that I could make twice the pay working at a local aluminum plant.
