Hatchery Happenings

What a great return for our hatchery salmon this year with over 625 counted. Those involved in spawning 3 and 4 years ago should be very proud of the number, size and health of these fish. As reported in the December 9th edition of the Curry County Reporter, Indian Creek Hatchery provided 598 pounds of vacuum-sealed fresh salmon fillets to the local food banks. With Fishermens Direct donating much of the processing costs, the Schniders donating their delivery expenses, the C.A.F. decided to contribute \$300 in the memory of Mike Foss to help pay for things like freezer bags.

The final spawning took place on December 1st in 21-degree weather after a broken pipe was fixed and the inch of ice was chipped away in the spawning shed. In total there were only five days of spawning over a four-week period with the first two days spawning 18 pair each day.

The 57 Riley Creek 2nd and 3rd graders visited the hatchery on November 24th to witness the spawning and also got to see hatchery fish spawning naturally in the creek.

The Underhills are now in charge of the 55 trays of eggs which have been hand picked and as of December 16th the first set of 18 trays have been run through the egg counter. The yields so far look excellent with only an average of a 9% loss. There is an estimated 64,100 eggs in these first 18 trays with the smallest at 1,767 and the largest at 4,421 eggs.

Volunteers are diligently performing their daily routines of measuring both temperature and D.O.'s. Everyone needs to be proud of the fine work being done this year at the hatchery.


