WOW! That was quite the storm we had on the weekend of Oct. 15. Here at my house we got a total of 9.5 inches of rain and wind that literally shook the house. So, with all that rain the Rogue River (and all the creeks feeding it) is flooding and this season's spawning fish are heading back to where they were born, including those coming back to Indian Creek Hatchery. You know, I'm not sure that all of you know this, but not all the fish coming back up the creek are coming to the hatchery. A lot of them spawn naturally further up the creek. Those that do come to the hatchery are used for spawning. If we get more fish than we need for spawning and the fish are still in good condition, CAF requests a special permit issued by ODFW and the fish are sent to Fishermen Direct for processing and packaging then given to the local food bank at no cost. So not only do we supplement the local sport fishing and commercial fall Chinook run, but we also help the needy. Gary Underhill and his crew are getting raceway #3 relined and ready for the new batch of fry. And our asphalt project to extend the roadway past the raceways to divert surface water runoff has all been approved and we are on the contractors to do list. So here we go again.

CAF General Meeting-Oct. 13, 2016

<u>President</u>- David Sophusson called the meeting to order at 10:05am. The minutes from the Sept. general meeting were approved as printed in the October edition of *The Riffle*. David stated that the Tidewater contract for improving the drainage in front of the raceways was signed by Scott Knox and the work will depend on Tidewater's schedule.

<u>Treasurer's report-</u> Barbara Huff was absent, so Becky Sophusson reported income for Sept. of \$7,447.57 and expenses of \$1,796.68 resulting in a monthly net income of \$5,650.89. The profit for the month is mainly due to the salmon derby, which has a few outstanding expenses. Thanks to Mary Duncan for being in charge of the derby.

Hatchery- Gary Underhill reported: there are 19 salmon in the brood tank thanks to the Huntley Park seining by ODFW; hydrogen peroxide treatment has begun; blocker dam is in place; fish ladder is ready; raceway 3 is being worked on.

A quick thank you and good job to the ODFW siegning crew and CAF volunteer Jim Pennington who has been assisting at Huntley. We had been contacted through the Gold Beach Ma Bell System that somehow a trampoline had been found tangled with trees in Indian Creek by the RV Park. The seining crew got in the creek and removed the obstruction before the rains hit and caused a problem for our returning fish.

We are having the annual RAISE A SALMON, EAT A PIZZA at Sunset Pizza on Nov 2nd starting at 5pm to 8pm. It's \$10.00 a person, all you can eat, with a salad too, and it benefits the Indian Creek Hatchery. Hope to see you all there; you can get tickets at the door or from a CAF member

Gary's been having work parties and they are currently working on installing the new liner in Raceway #3 and cleaning and prepping the stacks for spawning. We should start spawning around Nov. 15th, so if you haven't heard from me and want to help with spawning, please call me at 541 425-0396.
