

One thing we are struggling with, at least I am, is the number of new volunteers we are seeing lately, and how eager they are to help. Now you may think what is the problem with that? Well, for me, I'm terrible at remembering names, so forgive me if I ask, "What was your name again?" But on the serious side, although we are getting new members, we are also losing some of our older, long-time members. With them goes a huge amount of general hatchery knowledge procedures and practices. We had several new system upgrades at the hatchery that need to be included in our procedural manual. So right now, my goal is to get that manual updated and to get more volunteers involved in the work parties, cross training and spreading the load to more than just one person. We will get there; it's just going to take a little time. One good thing is that I'm working with a great group of people, and I appreciate each and every one of them!

CAF General Meeting

Feb. 8, 2018

<u>Call to Order</u> - President-David Sophusson called the meeting to order at 10:10am. The minutes from the December general meeting were approved as printed in the December edition of The Riffle. The board members from 2017 were reelected_and David thanked them for volunteering to serve on the board. David reported that the board of directors has approved the following officers for 2018:

> President - David Sophusson Vice-President - Gary Underhill Treasurer - Barbara Huff Secretary - Glenn Kral

Treasurer-Barbara Huff reported January income of \$16.04 and expenses of \$893.88. The proposed 2018 budget was prepared by Becky Sophusson and is being reviewed by the board. Approximate annual operating costs for the hatchery are \$22,000. Yearly donations approved by the board were: \$300 to Oregon Stewardship and \$100 to 4-H. CAF will continue to pay the \$25 membership fee for the Chamber of Commerce.

The Riffle-Mary Duncan has generously taken over as the editor and Hassie Taylor will be coeditor for alternate months this year. Please provide your contributions for the Riffle to both Hassie and Mary each month.

ODFW-The improvements are completed at Arizona Beach Pond (ABP) and future plans are being considered to include a shelter and handicapped access. Thirty five locals have signed up for the Angler Education training. There are 11,000 eggs in the Cedar Creek hatch boxes being monitored by Joe Janowicz, David Barnes and John Wilson.

Hatchery-Gary Underhill reported: Raceway #3 is completed; Aaron Duncan coordinated the delivery of the year's food supply; the first ponding took place February 9.

There was a burglary at the hatchery resulting in loss of salvageable metal items and damage to locks/latches. Repairs will be made and locks replaced. While the cameras worked, poor lighting prevented identifiable pictures. Pat Kellis cleaned the spider webs from the LED lights and Coos Curry Electric has scheduled replacement of their pole light.

2018 Salmon Derby-Mary Duncan reported that our request from the Coquille Federated Indian Tribe was denied. It's time to organize a committee and set a date for the derby. In response to Mary's appeal four members quickly volunteered to work with Mary. Gary Underhill made the motion to hold the derby August 1-4, Art Tidmarsh seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

After eight selflessly committed years working on making the derby a success, Jim Carey will step back and offer advice and support from the background.

Fin Clipping-June 18-22 with tagging of 25,000. Office remodel-The board approved a remodel of the hatchery office to include ceiling, cabinets, vermin proofing and door access. Work will start when the fish are out of the incubation room.

Dorothy and Eldridge Combs Memorial Fund-Jim Freedman will talk to the LRWC about the return of unused funds for Arizona Beach signage. If the future improvements at ABP are possible, the remaining funds could be used there.

They raised koi fish for 25 years back east, but having an osprey nest in your yard here pretty much made that hobby "disappear" just like lunch. Volunteering at the hatchery keeps them close to a different kind of fish activity.

They have yet to catch a salmon (only tried three times) and will gladly accept all

invitations from the ol' hands at this sport. "We have been trading our honey for fish."

They have been beekeeping for 12 years, and their honey won First Place and Best in Show at the Oregon State Fair in Salem last year. "We blew the prize money at Popeye's Fried Chicken on our way out of town".

Dave and Carol bought a boat last year and enjoy spending time on the river with their dog Ruby. "Back east, it's mostly open water boating. There's no rocks, no riffles, no rapids, no rafters. Learning how to run a river has been a whole new experience for us. We did ten trips from Agness to Blossom Bar last summer, and probably are still not ready to do it by ourselves". Most summer nights you'll see us out cruising on the bay enjoying the sunset from the water. "What an incredible way to end the day."

Dave and Carol started out volunteering as evening feeders, then Dave took over Linda Tarwater's board position last year, as well as the weekly weighing of the fish done previously by Bill and Carol Fetzer. This year, Dave is coordinating the feeder schedule. grant application writing with Mary Duncan and John Weber for funding and new equipment. Dave's hobbies include: exploring local beaches and gravel bars, improving his view from his chair in front of the fireplace, and generally avoiding misfortune and unhappiness. "I hope to add salmon slayer to my hobbies this year".
