


# **President's Corner**

Here we go again! We have fish in raceway #1. I was really concerned that, with the spawning taking five weeks to complete instead of the normal three weeks, problems would arise with so many different size fish. We delivered the first batch of fry to the raceway on Feb. 21. expected to only have the first three incubator trays ready but, as it turned out, thirteen trays became ready at the same time. Raceway #1 now has about 34,000 very healthy and active little swimmers from end to end. They must have felt like they were dumped into the ocean with all that new play space. Now we just hope that some of the other trays that have hatched, but are still alevins, will be buttoned up fry at the same time and we won't have to split up any of the raceways. We will know more in about two weeks. It is now time to ask for volunteers for feeding. It only takes about an hour per day in the morning and you can volunteer for one day or as many as you would like. Any amount of volunteer time helps. ### Volunteer Profile of the Month By Alan Lee

Alan Lee, still often known as Mr. Lee, was the English teacher in room 6 at Gold Beach High School. For almost 30 years, he dragged lures and literature in front of teenagers hoping to get them to bite on a verb or metaphor.

Fewer people know about his first 30 years. Alan was born a wunderkind of the water. Spin casting a Super-Duper in Yellowstone Lake, Alan started his angling career landing 10 trout in 30 minutes. He was only three. He was designing, tying, and selling his own flies at 8. His first date in high school involved catching lots of steelhead. While in college, Alan did not watch the Ducks, but the water in the McKenzie River, and with his keen eye for water conditions, hundreds of large anadromous fish found their way into his freezer. With the purchase of a boat, Alan took an even greater toll on fish populations everywhere. His fishing lifestyle soon became unsustainable. Alan simply was catching too many fish. It wasn't fair to the fish or other anglers. Although some people believe that the ODFW paid Alan to stop fishing, that rumor is not true. Neither is he responsible for the creation of bag limits. In 1985 Alan voluntarily quit fishing in an attempt restore stocks on the west coast of North Although Alan is now volunteering America. with CAF, fish and fishermen need not worry: he is not going to start fishing again; he is only going to start helping Hassie with The Riffle.

# **CAF General Meeting**

February 14, 2019

**President-**Dave Sophusson called the meeting to order at 10:06am. The minutes from the Nov. 8<sup>th</sup> and Dec. 8th meetings were approved.

<u>**Treasurer-**</u>Barbara Spani reported a gross profit of \$554.48 and total expenses of \$490.93 ending the month with a net income of \$63.55.

Hatchery-Gary Underhill reported that we have 89,000 eggs this year. This year the hatchery has been dealing with drought conditions. A comparison was made to conditions two years ago when the issue was too much water.

Gary then talked about the upcoming ponding preparation and said the raceway cleaning is going well, about halfway completed. A workday(s) will be scheduled for general cleanup and maintenance. This year's failed egg level (morts) was 10%; 8% to 12% is considered normal.

Curtis Edwards was hired to trap otters and relocate them humanely.

David Barnes gave an update on the feeding schedule He is looking for evening feeders to hand feed and weigh out food for the following day. There are only a couple of daytime feeding spots open if you are interested in volunteering to feed. Contact David Barnes if interested @ 541-425-5592. Also, a reminder was given to remember to document all feedings.

**Reel Fishing Days at Arizona Pond-** The dates are locked in: April 17<sup>th</sup> (Wednesday) Brookings; April 18<sup>th</sup> (Thursday) Brookings; April 23<sup>rd</sup> (Tuesday) Gold Beach & Port Orford; April 25<sup>th</sup> (Thursday) Brookings; May 17<sup>th</sup> (Friday) 60 6<sup>th</sup> grade students from Medford. This date might change.

ODFW puts this program together to teach students to fish. Students learn to tie hooks, cast and, hopefully, take home a fish. ODFW supplies all the equipment and splits the cost of food with the hatchery. Lunch will be provided for the volunteers (pizza and sandwiches). Last year there weren't enough sandwiches.

<u>**R**</u> **E GRANT** (restoration and enhancement grant) David Barnes reported that we received \$7,500 for new stacks (incubation trays). David

has been talking with the roadmaster and Curry County Commissioners about the much needed repairs to the Ferry Hole Boat Launch. It is the only launch on that side of the river before Foster Bar. He is looking at another possible grant that could be used for repairs and enhancement.

Hatchery Tours – run from Memorial Day to Labor Day. David Barnes has been taking photographs and video of events at the hatchery .Discussion: purchase a digital frame to show the happenings at the hatchery.

<u>The Riffle-</u> With the help of two new volunteers (Alan Lee & Janet Hoffman), the next newsletter will be published in March.

# A Step Back in Time

The Macleay Estate purchased Mr. Hume's holdings in 1910 and continued to operate the Indian Creek Hatchery.

#### Gold Beach Reporter Nov. 22, 1923

Two million eggs were brought to Indian Creek Hatchery and when the young salmon fry attained the proper age, they were placed in the Rogue River.

"The Indian Creek Hatchery is the only privately conducted hatchery known to the salmon industry, all others either being maintained by state or federal government aid and under their control and management. This one is supplied entirely by the Macleay Estate company, and it is understood that only in this way is it possible to have the Rogue at this point stocked with salmon fry, for the state game and fish commission will not undertake to ship in the fry because of the remote distance from supply base, and also the difficulty getting them here. However, it is hoped that the completion of the Roosevelt Highway, and the betterment of shipping facilities that the state commission can realize the importance of assisting in this industry in this locality."

#### DAILY FEEDING SCHEDULE

#### DAILY FEEDING SCHEDULE

Start hand feeding first. Hand feed slowly. Clean screens in raceways after the start of hand feeding. Remove "Morts" (fatalities) – record the number for each raceway. Next fill/load autofeeders in the raceways not being vacuumed. After vacuuming, fill/load the rest of the auto feeders.

#### ADDITIONAL WORK TO BE COMPLETED (AS NEEDED).

Clean & brush the screens and sides not already cleaned/brushed. Take and record temperature and DO (dissolved oxygen) –

(Thermometer is at the end of raceway #1).

Record data for each raceway in record book in the office.

### **CLEANING/BRUSHING SCREENS, SIDES – VACUUMING**

Brush both sides of screens at the end of the raceways.

Brush sides of raceways as needed.

When vacuuming – prime the pump by filling the "pot", if the pump does not prime itself by the time you count to 60.

Clean the pumps basket often – more often when the raceway is dirty/full of sand .

Do not over tighten the lid on the "pot".

Do not vacuum without the basket in the vacuum pump.

#### **FILLING/LOADING AUTO FEEDERS**

Wind clock by pulling the belt all the way to the back of the feeder – but no farther.

Spread the food on the center of the full length of the belt. Check to make sure that the clocks are running.

If you need to wash your hands, soap and water are available in incubation room.

Rubber gloves are available.
