CAF General Meeting

CAF General Meeting minutes 2-13-2020

Board members attending: Aaron Duncan, Joe Janowicz, Roger Lindquist, Barbara Spani, Jack Sheehan, Gene Trinkler, Gary Underhill and David Sophusson.

John Weber gave presentation on Snout tagging. Reasons to do snout tagging: for the purpose of evaluation of our hatchery's performance, Survival numbers of fish, release strategy; performance in fisheries; indicate how the fish do in the ocean; fresh water harvest; and to track our returns.

Currently we are not getting results for good data. John Weber would like CAF volunteers to get involved in this program. CAF would finance the prizes used for incentive to participate in the

program. April will be the target date to begin snout collection. ODFW has built a kiosk at the Port of Gold Beach cleaning station in the marina for deposit of the fish snouts. CAF would encourage surveyor staff to turn in the snouts.

This program would involve Lex's Landing, Jot's Resort, The Port of Gold Beach, and Rogue Outdoor Store.

John Weber reports ocean productivity is down, and the potential for a La Nina this the spring is good.

South Coast Fishermen have been actively participating in the Snout Collection Program here are some of their numbers:

Chetco Snout recovery 2010 thru 2014 = 313 Ferry Creek recovery 2010 thru 2014 = 568 (every year Ferry Creek release out performs the main stem release.)

It is important that our group help collect the fish snouts, assist in training anglers on how to do it, be in charge of the raffle, and get the recorded reading from the fish snouts.

Netting could increase the number of fish snouts that get collected at Indian Creek.

There was some discussion about the fact that we do not tag every fish, and how to go about setting up the raffle.

It was decided that as long as people turn in a snout at the Kiosk, they are entered in the raffle. If you turn in a snout you made the effort, you should be in the raffle.

CANCELLED: Reels fish days are 4/14/2020, 4/16/2020, 4/21/2020, 4/23/2020
Barbara Spani gave the Treasurers report:
December we took in \$1395.75 in donations and spent \$4688.31. A loss of \$3202.56
Roger reported on painting the brood tank, Roger reviewed the particulars with the group.
Gary Underhill's Report:

We should have 82,000 viable eggs. Ponding first group of fish into raceway 1 on 2-14-2020. Gary said hand feeding begins Saturday. Be careful, decks can be slippery, Gary did sand. New pressure washer works great, the old one can be lent out, just contact Gary.

Aaron talked about the winch project. Tentative Dates for the Salmon Derby are 7-30. 7-31 and 8-1-2020.

John Weber and Dave Barnes talked about the Conservation Management Plan on the Native fish issues:

CANCELLED:There is a meeting at the Library in February 26th at 9 a.m. at the Curry Public Library. All who can attend please do. Let's wear our hats to show who we are and what we represent.

Roger talked about fundraising efforts available to us: McKays, Rays, Fred Meyer, and Amazon Smile are good programs for fund raising. He said he is having an article printed in the Riffle to explain how they work.

Mary Duncan has volunteered to do the Riffle 4 times a year.

Meeting adjourned

COME TO OUR MEETINGS

Besides raising and then putting 80,000 to 100,000 young salmon in the Rogue River every year, we show the residents and visitors in Curry County how we do this and who makes it happen.

To get this message out, we have a meeting on the second Thursday of every month except in December and January. This takes place in the meeting room at Jots Resort. It is open to all. The meeting typically starts at 10:00 a.m. and lasts about one and a half hours. After the members and quests hear about what is happening at the Indian Creek Hatchery, we have a raffle and the lucky ticket holder(s) receive a gift certificate worth up to \$50. The raffle would not be possible without the generosity of the gift certificate donors: The Rogue Outdoor Store, Rachel's (in the book store), the Chowder House, Gold Beach Lumber and the Landing Restaurant. I urge all of our members and the general public to support these generous donors.

Spawning of 82,000 Chinook Salmon happened in November, 2019. Two raceways have ponded, with the third group of fry going into raceway 2 this week. Ways to help the Hatchery through donations

As many of you are aware, we have been getting donations from the collection of McKay's receipts as well as by linking your Ray's rewards cards to the hatchery account. The board thanks everyone for their help with these rewards programs. As a reminder:

McKay's

McKay's will rebate back to the hatchery 1% of eligible purchased items. Receipts must be dated within the last 12 months and all McKay's receipts, not just Gold Beach, are eligible. There are collection containers at the following locations: Oceanside RV Park, Turtle Cove RV Park, Indian Creek RV park, the Crow's Nest restaurant, Rogue Outdoor Store, and at the hatchery itself, or they may be turned in at any monthly meeting.

Ray's

With your Ray's rewards card, talk to a manager and have them go into their computer and link your card to Curry Anadromous Fishermen, account number 50642. Then, each time you make a purchase at Ray's, give them your rewards card number or phone number. A donation will be sent to us each guarter.

We have recently added two more opportunities for members, friends, family, etc. to help us receive donations to the hatchery through purchases. In addition to McKay's and Ray's we have set up accounts with Fred Meyer and

Amazon Smile. The following is how you can participate if you so choose in these fund raising efforts.

Fred Meyer

Link your Rewards Card to the hatchery at fredmeyer.com. Enrolling is an easy process that's clearly outlined on the site. Customers can begin earning donations for our nonprofit when they shop at Fred Meyer using a linked Rewards Card. This is an ongoing program and customers may enroll at any time. First log into your account and next select Community Rewards; it is on the left side. Type Curry Anadromous Fishermen in the search bar. Once our organization comes up hit enroll. This will not affect your existing Fred Meyer's rewards or gas rewards program; you will just be providing a donation to the hatchery with eligible purchases.

Amazon Smile

On your first visit to AmazonSmile, smile.amazon.com, you need to select a charitable

organization to receive the donations from eligible purchases before you begin shopping. Amazon will remember your selection, and then every eligible purchase you make at smile.amazon.com will result in a donation. This cannot, at this time, be accessed from the Amazon App for iOS or Android, so you will need to access through a web browser. If you have an existing Amazon account this will not affect it, you will just be providing a donation to the hatchery with eligible purchases. This program is a great way for friends and family from out of town to help support our hatchery.

SCHOLARSHIPS FOR 2020

For the fourth year your Indian Creek Hatchery will be offering a financial scholarship to one qualified graduating student from each of the high schools in Curry county. Home schooled students may also apply.

The selection committee considers the academic record, the chosen field of study, the community and civic record and the financial need of each applicant. Until this year each scholarship was \$500.00 (Five-Hundred dollars). This year the award will be \$1,000.00 (One-Thousand dollars).

We have been asked, what is the source of the funds? The board is vigilant to use its operating funds for that purpose - to operate. The scholarship funds have all come from a generous donation contributed by an active member and the proceeds of part of an estate left to the hatchery by a member.

The hatchery board is aware how dependent it is on community involvement and participation in our operation. Through this scholarship program we strive to show our appreciation and in this way express our thanks.

We urge all interested residents to become active members and join us in placing between eighty and one hundred thousand salmon in the Rogue River every year.

SNOUT RECOVERY PROGRAM

In an effort to understand fishery contribution and improve hatchery performance, the Curry Anadromous Fishermen (CAF) will be sponsoring a coded wire tag (CWT) snout collection effort.

The group will have stations located at key fish cleaning areas and boat landings. The stations will have baggies and a place for volunteers to donate snouts from fish they caught that are missing the adipose fin. Also, there will be a small ticket to fill out for use in a raffle for some nice prizes. There will be two separate raffle drawings. One for Spring Chinook season, and a separate drawing for Indian Creek fish in the fall.

CAF volunteers, with their combined experience implementing the hatchery programs, who know the importance of this data collection, is the best group to spearhead this project. Roger Lindquist CAF Volunteer and board member, states "we put all these fish out with a coded wire tag, that disappear into garbage cans after being cleaned. I figure we may want to make an effort to recover these tags and figure out if the fish are being caught in this fishery".

ODFW STEP Biologist John Weber agrees: "CAF volunteers have the best understanding of the importance of the CWT's, and how the tags are used to determine the success of a hatchery program"


The CWT's tell fishery managers where the fish are being caught, and how successful the fish survive while being in the ocean/river. With the lower water conditions during the last two year, the Indian Creek fish have had a hard time returning to the hatchery. In cases like that, it is important to get as many tags as you can recover. In addition, the release strategies have changed for the Rogue Spring Chinook program, with more tag recoveries release strategies can be fine-tuned for better survival and greater benefit to the fishery.
