April is the month for "Reel Fish Days" at Arizona Pond fishing with third grade children from all schools in Curry County, running April 18, 20, and 25, 2023.



Welcome to the new year! We have been busy since the last Riffle. We spawned over 90,000 eggs, and they are in the incubation trays. Next, we will be putting the fry into the raceways. With the new year here, I would like to recap last year. Thank you to all the members and volunteers that participated throughout 2022 in one way or other! We raised and released 85,000 fish in a time in our history of some uncertainty. We supported the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) this last spring with Reel Fish Days at Arizona Pond, located just off the 101 Hwy north of the Prehistoric Gardens. That event involved all Curry County 3rd graders. This was done informally, with the parents assisting their kids as they learned fishing rod technics, the elements of casting, as well as hook safety and knot tying from C.A.F. volunteers; this event is one of our favorite activities of the year. Thousand-dollar grants were awarded to deserving students from each of the local high schools. The funds will be used to help further their college goals.

We took on a new fundraiser this last year; we manned the admission gates at the 2022 Curry County Fair. This was, by all accounts, a lot of fun!

The annual Salmon Derby held in early August was a big success, and from a fundraising perspective, it was the biggest one in recent memory.

The last accomplishment is of particular importance to the future success of our hatchery. I want to thank each and every one of you for reaching out to folks. Through the group's efforts we were able to recruit twenty-five new members.

With the new year we are looking to exceed last year's success, and we can only do it with your help. We have our monthly general meetings the 3rd Saturday of each month, at the Gold Beach Community Center. We want to accomplish more community support activities, but can only do so with your support through volunteering!

General Meeting and upcoming events for 2023

At the last general meeting in January, Gary reported that we have 90,000 healthy fish in the incubation trays, and ponding is set for mid-February. All eggs are thriving and have reached the alevin stage of development. Gary has created the feeder schedule, and needs volunteers to sign up with him to help with the daily hand feed. A rock slide occurred and broke the spring line going to the hatchery. Water from the main line was used for egg incubation. The spring line was repaired and system has been restored from backup water to the spring line water. A work party to pressure wash the raceways and tidy up the fish food storage area was held on January 23rd. The raceways are ready to go. Be careful when you visit as the raceway decking is slippery. Sanding of the deck will be undertaken soon.

Volunteers Needed:

We still have one board position unfilled at this time. If you are interested in helping make the big decisions for the Hatchery, please speak to a board member about the duties and responsibilities involved. You are welcome to attend a board meeting to see if it is something for you.

Curry County Fair, and parade held in late July. Salmon Derby to be held in early August. Membership appreciation dinner that takes place in mid-December.

We have been asked by the Curry County Fair Board to be in charge of the admission gates during the Curry County Fair.

Joe Janowitz brought up the idea of having a C.A.F. booth at the fair. We would offer hats, tee shirts, and information. Having a booth at the fair could help bring awareness of what we do to a wider range of people.

The hatchery will again support Reel Fish Days. This ODFW event involves C.A.F. support of Curry County's third graders, and their families at Arizona Pond for a spring fishing event. Roger Lindquist asked if there were any other ideas for fund raising events. Mary Duncan thought we could set up a pizza night and Bill Budd talked of a rummage sale. Bill said he will coordinate the rummage sale event. Warren Riemath and Mary Duncan will work on the rummage sale with Bill.

Bill Budd also brought up the idea of having a float in the fair parade in late July. Roger will look into the pizza night fundraiser idea.

Ways to help the Hatchery through donations

As many of you are aware, we have been getting donations from the collection of McKay's receipts as well as by linking your Ray's rewards cards to the hatchery account. The board thanks everyone for their help with these rewards programs. One of our donation activities, Amazon Smile, is discontinuing their program.

McKay's

McKay's will rebate back to the hatchery 1% of eligible purchased items. Receipts must be dated within the last 12 months and all McKay's receipts, not just Gold Beach, are eligible. There are collection containers at the following locations: Turtle Rock RV Park, Indian Creek R.V. Park, the Crow's Nest Restaurant, Rogue Outdoor Store, and at the hatchery itself, or they may be turned in at any monthly meeting.

Ray's

With your Ray's rewards card, talk to a manager and have them go into their computer and link your card to Curry Anadromous Fishermen, account number 50642. Then, each time you make a purchase at Ray's, give them your rewards card number or phone number. A donation will be sent to us each quarter.

Fred Meyer

Link your Rewards Card to the hatchery at fredmeyer.com. Enrolling is an easy process that's clearly outlined on the site. Customers can begin earning donations for our nonprofit when they shop at Fred Meyer using a linked Rewards Card. This is an ongoing program and customers may enroll at any time. First log into your account and next select Community Rewards; it is on the left side. Type Curry Anadromous Fishermen in the search bar. Once our organization comes up hit enroll. This will not affect your existing Fred Meyer's rewards or gas rewards program; you will just be providing a donation to the hatchery with eligible purchases.


