

#### CAF General Meeting

June 11, 2015

**President-** David Sophusson called the meeting to order at 10:15am. Minutes from the April and June meetings were approved as printed in the June edition of *The Riffle*. David informed everyone that Don Foss passed away and that Gary Harmon is recovering at home following a heart attack. We all wish Bo Gemeinhardt a speedy recovery.

Treasurer- Barbara Jorge reported a monthly loss for May of \$817.67. There were miscellaneous expenses for Reel Fishing Days and a \$270 expense for taxes and bookkeeping. HATCHERY- Gary Underhill reported: water pressure and oxygen levels are fine; the oxygen system will be activated after fin clipping; the vacuum systems are working well except for a breaker tripping when both systems are used together; the mort rate is high in raceway 3 and samples have been sent for analysis; the spiders in the D.O. box are getting larger. 2015 Fundraisers- The fireworks booth will be operational from June 27th thru July 4th. Most positions for the BiMart Country Music Festival have been filled and Becky S. expects all positions to be filled by CAF members. Plans for the salmon derby are going well and Harry Carlson is looking for a chairman trainee. Sunset Family Pizza has a new owner, but the fall pizza night commitment will be honored. Free Fishing Day- The turnout was great with 84 registered children. Hot dogs and fixings were donated by McKay's and Ray's and 67 prizes were awarded. ODFW- The ODFW volunteer form needs to be signed by everyone who works at the hatchery. The completion of the ODFW form is required by the CAF insurance carrier.


