down the blackberries and nettles around the raceways. Now I can put the D.O. probes back into each raceway and get that system back online. Also, by the time you read this I should have the new booster water pump wired, plumbed, and running. I can't wait to see what that will do for our water supply for the hatchery building.

We now have more information on our job assignments for the Country Music Festival. Becky will be contacting you to volunteer for the event. Hope to see you there. Thanks to everyone for your support and the hours you have put in to help raise our fish for 2014!

CAF General Meeting

May 8, 2014

David Sophusson, president, called the meeting to order at 10:10am. The minutes from the May general meeting were approved as printed in the June issue of The Riffle. At last week's board meeting, Harry Carlson was unanimously approved to fill the vacant board position. The board approved the purchase of 500 brochures to distribute around town.

Treasurer's report- Barbara Jorge reported the May monthly loss of \$834.16. A donation of \$300 was made to Oregon Stewardship in appreciation for their continued involvement with riparian education of K-12 students in Curry County.

Hatchery- There was a pressure drop in the water flow due to leaves blocking the inlet screen at the vault. The oxygen generator system will be turned on as needed when the water flow decreases.

The new sign is 98% ready to install. The slip preventative deck surface will be applied when activity scheduling allows.

Volunteer Coordinator- Chris Underhill reported that Free Fishing Day went smoothly with 58 children registering. Awards of fishing poles, tackle boxes and gift certificates from local merchants were given out with the free lunch and drinks. Chris will be calling volunteers for fin clipping, which begins June 23rdconducted on Wed., Fri. and Saturday.

Fireworks- Becky Sophusson has the schedule ready for volunteer signups to work the booth beginning June 27th larger profit percentage this year. Becky really needs a replacement chairperson next year, if CAF wants to continue this fundraiser. BiMart Music Festival- CAF will staff 2 VIP hospitality tents Aug. 1-3. Becky has all the details worked out and will signup volunteers and coordinate an organizational meeting well in advance.

Salmon Derby- Harry Carlson will chair the derby and work with Jim Carey on the details. Jim has most of the information generated by Mike Kopec and he'll pass it on to Harry. Harry has a volunteer willing to help generate the donation request letters.

CAF is very thankful that Harry volunteered to continue making the derby a significant fundraiser for the hatchery. Harry assisted Mike as the "derby chairman in training" for the last 2 years.

John Epps- John has worked out the price and coordinated the ODFW grant details for intake screens on the 2 emergency water pumps. CAF will provide matching funds of in-kind labor for installing the screens, as well as, spending up to \$550 for materials.

New meeting place- Dave & Becky had a conversation with Mangia Buff restaurant owner Kevin Buffington about his offer to have CAF hold the monthly general meeting at the restaurant. Attendees could have breakfast at 9am and the meeting would begin at 10am.

CAF General Meeting

July 10, 2014

<u>David Sophusson</u>, president, called the meeting to order at 10:00am. David welcomed everyone to Mangia Buff and thanked owner Kevin Buffington for offering CAF the use of his dining area. Since *The Riffle* was not printed before today's meeting, the minutes from the June general meeting will be printed in the next edition of *The Riffle* and approved at the August general meeting.

<u>Treasurer's report-</u> Barbara Jorge reported the May monthly loss of \$619.24. Our monthly incomes will improve with the 3 major fundraisers.

Hatchery- The leaves blocking the inlet screen at the vault are still a problem. The oxygen generator system is operating. Volunteers need to be careful about over tightening the covers on the vacuum pumps. Jim Freedman donated a handmade, custom cover remover in case someone has trouble opening the vacuum filter enclosure. Tour activity has increased and so have donations. Fin clipping went very well and was completed in 3-1/2 days. There are still high mortality counts.

Fireworks- Becky Sophusson reported an estimated profit of \$1,800 and thanked all the volunteers for helping. Becky and Dave were thanked by the audience for all their hours to make sure the fundraiser went smoothly. CAF appreciates the contributions of Jim Carey for the excellent location in front of The Rogue Outdoor Store and Mark Pearson for the loan of the storage trailer.

BiMart Music Festival- This first year's concert is a learning experience for everyone involved, but should be a much smoother operation if it's held again. Becky has all the volunteers signed up and is optimistic that this will be a profitable fundraiser for CAF. The board authorized the expenditure necessary to pay (reduced price) for the camping spaces needed for the full shift, onsite volunteers.

<u>Salmon Derby-</u> Sponsor request letters have been mailed and plans are on track.

<u>ODFW-</u> John Weber announced that the annual Step BBQ will be held on Aug. 9th at Tugman State Park and is sponsored by the STEP volunteers from Florence. Since there has been no apparent explanation for this year's

excessive mortality rate, new samples have been submitted to the lab for culturing.

New meeting place-Mangia Buff restaurant owner Kevin Buffington introduced himself, welcomed everyone and thanked CAF for coming. Kevin explained that he's glad to help out CAF and will become a new sponsor. A gracious applause for Kevin.
