2014 CAF Salmon Derby Results

Other additions to this year's derby included music with Dylan from Corner Drug as disc jockey and Kevin from Mangia Buff who offered patrons a nice plate of pasta, salad, and garlic bread for \$10.00.

It was great working with Jim Carey, and I can't imagine doing this derby without him. Jim was at the helm again as overall event coordinator and project manager. He ran the nuts and bolts of the derby.

CAF General Meeting

Sep. 11, 2014

<u>Glenn Kral</u>, secretary, called the meeting to order at 10:00am.

<u>Minutes-</u> The minutes for the August meeting were approved as printed in *The Riffle.*

<u>**Treasurer's report-</u>** Barbara Jorge was absent, so Glenn reported the information that was available at last week's board meeting without a statement from the vacationing bookkeeper. There are derby and concert expenses outstanding, but the majority of the income for August was: \$7655 concert, \$1,500 derby; \$750 from Middle Rogue Steelheaders for emergency pump screening. A detailed accounting will be available next month.</u>

Salmon Derby- Harry Carlson reported that this derby had the most entrants, the most fish caught on a single day and the most fish caught in total. There were 2 new casino donations, more city of Gold Beach business donations and great participation for the derby discount booklet that Harry put together. Dean Hendricks of North Country Lures & Flies, LLC, was, once again, a major prize donor. The city of Gold Beach donated \$1,000 for promotional expenses. Everyone appreciated having the Sunday evening festivities at the Event Center.

Hatchery- Gary Underhill has the facility cleaned up and ready for the deck painting work next week. Repairs are being made to be ready for the new spawning season. The unused kiosk sign has been installed on the wall of the spawning area. "Non potable water" signs will be purchased and installed where appropriate.

YAHOO- A replacement refrigerator has been donated by Don & Cathy Wood. It's not self-cleaning, so we need to date items that are stored. Thanks Don & Cathy!

<u>Also-</u> Jim Freedman has reserved Nov. 5th from 5-7:30pm with Sunset Family Pizza for CAF to sponsor a pizza fundraiser. This is a very generous offer from owner, Carla VanProoyen, and the CAF volunteers are grateful for this opportunity.

Volunteer Profile of the Month Bill Fetzer

Bill Fetzer is a key player in the running of our hatchery. He is responsible for weighing fish weekly with the help of his wife, Carol. His job is to calculate how much food our salmon babies should be eating. At each weighing, Bill and Carol take three samples per raceway counting approximately 30-35 fish per sample. Bill has kept meticulous records over a period of a decade on how much the fish consume. In the beginning ODFW provided a chart with an approximate feeding schedule, but Bill has tweaked that and the information he provides today is more accurate.


Bill and Carol have volunteered for the hatchery since moving to Gold Beach in 2003. It was Mike and Tony Foss who got Bill involved with CAF. Bill participates in most fundraisers including the recent Cape Blanco Music Festival (sponsored by Bi-Mart), the sale of fireworks in July, the fin-clipping in May and the Sunset Pizza fundraiser in the fall. He was also active in hatchery work parties.

Bill was born in Hartford, Connecticut in 1945. He moved to the west coast in the Los Angeles area and then spent four years in the Navy that included three tours to Vietnam. Bill then worked for P G & E as a machinist until 1995 when he went on disability due to a back injury.

Beginning Oct. 1st ODFW will start holding any Chinook Salmon they collect during seining up at Huntley Park for broodstock. Mid Oct. I'll be calling for volunteers to help pull nets up at Lobster Bridge to collect more broodstock for the hatchery. If you'd like to help please contact me, it's good if you have waders and keep in mind, we do this rain or shine.

Raceways #2 and #3 were released on August 26th, so a total of 87,000 Chinook Salmon Smolt were released into the Rogue River Estuary. It's because of all you hardworking volunteers that this program is such a success and possible. Pat yourselves on the back. Good Job!!

We started September off with the CAF Rogue River Salmon Derby that ran from Sept. 2nd-7th. 
