President's Corner

With the exceptional help from our volunteers, our fireworks fund raiser was a great success in that we doubled our profits from last year. Becky and I feel that since the 4th fell on a Thursday, many folks had a four day weekend which gave them a chance to travel here to the coast. I noticed that a great deal of our sales went to families from out of state. We also feel that with the 4th hovering around a weekend for the next few years sales should continue to be profitable. The hatchery is doing well and the fish are doing great, but July didn't go by without its problems. We had a bit of a low water flow issue on the fourth itself and Tom Tostenson was called into action by the alarm company as a first responder. It turned out later that the water flow problem went a bit deeper than first thought, but with the guidance of Gary Underhill, the problem was solved with no harm to the fish. One good thing we learned from this experience is that with our emergency backup systems online we can keep the fish healthy and happy indefinitely even without any water flow from our main water line. So as with most things in life, what appears to be a crisis can also have beneficial side effects. So for now I can only hope that the month of August goes smoothly. The sign on my door is going to say "Gone Fish'in".

CAF General Meeting

July 11, 2013

<u>David Sophusson</u>, president, called the meeting to order at 10:07am. Several groups of boy scouts stopped in Gold Beach on their river trip and volunteered to help at the hatchery. Chris and others had them clean out rocks and debris behind the blocker dam and do some work on the kiosk. They did a fantastic job and were a great help to CAF. A number of tours have been given and CAF has received some very nice donations along with appreciation for the great work we do.

<u>Treasurer's report-</u> Barbara Jorge reported an June loss of \$1,633.13 and bank balance of \$12,055.76. The deck is now completed and our monthly balances should improve.

<u>Fundraisers</u>- The July 6th salmon was cancelled because of the increase in salmon prices. Thanks to Becky Sophusson's guidance, the fireworks booth went smoothly (again) and netted almost double the poor return of last year. Becky will not be in charge next year, so we need to find a new chairperson or, better yet, come up with a different fundraiser. CAF greatly appreciates the time contribution from all the volunteers. We very much appreciate the generosity of Jim Carey for allowing us to operate the booth in the parking lot of The Rogue Outdoor Store.

<u>Hatchery-</u> Vice president, Gary Underhill, reported that a low water alarm was issued on July 4th and the emergency pumps came on as expected. The next day it was discovered that the flow valve at the vault had been closed. An investigation of the circumstance is being conducted. The vault screen is being repaired by Freeman Marine and we need to ask ODFW to approve a backup screen. The spring line has been closed to eliminate debris that has fouled the outlet valves. Gary will post a note to volunteers to clean the oxygen screens.

<u>ODFW-</u> John Weber anticipates a smolt release around the middle of Aug. and a second release at the end of Aug.

BOARD MEMBERS- This is the time for volunteers to consider serving on the board of directors. The board meeting is only about 2hours once a month and a diversity of ideas and backgrounds are extremely important to keep our organization running smoothly.

The one thing I'd like to tell everyone about this month is Boy Scout Troop 125 out of Redding, California. Zane Grey's Rogue River: Past and Present

A river seems like a timeless thing but civilization has a way of making itself felt. This is very apparent when you read Zane Grey's Roque River Feud. Grey himself was a lover of the river and had the cabin up the North Bank that was pictured last month in The Riffle and was .accessible only by boat and afforded him the privacy he craved. During his lifetime, he passed away in 1939, he had great success with his books and was friend to many Hollywood celebrities who were guests at the cottage. The book was written in 1929 and centered on the time right after World War I, so the differences in the river are dramatically clear in his wonderful descriptions of the river. Absent are the Patterson Bridge, the jetties, and certainly no fish hatchery.

Excerpts from Zane Grey's Rogue River Feud

If you are a fisherman or a lover of the river, or, for that matter, a resident of Gold Beach, this book is just about required reading and is available at the Curry County Public Library here in Gold Beach. The action centers mostly in Gold Beach when our heroes are not shooting the rapids from Grants Pass down to the coast, or net fishing the mouth of the river.

CHAPTER ONE

"Deep and dark green, swift and clear, icy cold and as pure as the snows from which it sprang, the river had its source in the mountain under Crater Lake. It was a river at its birth; and it glided away through the Oregon Forest, with hurrying momentum, as if eager to begin the long leap down through the Siskiyou's. The giant firs shaded it; the deer drank from it; the little black-backed trout rose greedily to floating flies. And in sunlit glades where the woods lightened, the wild lilac bloomed in its marvelous profusion of color, white with purple and pink, scenting the warm drowsy air with sweet fragrance."

He describes Gold Beach as a roaring town filled with gold prospectors, Indians and fishermen of every stripe. Saloons are prevalent and with them lots of alcohol and gambling and of course, a fight or two. There was lots of action going on in Gold Beach.

"Then a dull heavy roar of tumbling waters smoked his ears. His hair seems to freeze at the roots and stood up still. From boyhood he had been taught to respect the Rogue. Companions of his youth had defied the river to find watery and unknown graves. The skiff was now in the middle of the stream. The current was quickening; he roar grew clearer Garry turned to whisper: "All we gotta do is hit the middle where she dips." P.25

Volunteer of the Month Profile Mary Duncan

Mary was born in Los Angeles, CA and moved to Coburg, OR in 1959. Coburg is the northern gateway to central Lane County amidst the farmland of the beautiful Willamette Valley. There she lived on five acres with fruit and nut trees and farm animals. This farming lifestyle included raising animals for food, canning, making pickles, and much more. She was also involved in horse training and broke horses for a ranch in Coburg as well as giving horseback riding lessons to children.

One of Mary's favorite hobbies is making jewelry. Her interest in jewelry making began in high school. There she learned the lost wax art of jewelry making.

Mary is also skilled in Taekwondo, a martial art originating in Korea that combines combat and self-defense techniques with sport and exercise. She began to study Taekwondo in 1969 and received her black belt in 1971. So, don't mess with Mary! While living in Eugene, she gave classes in this martial art form to police officers over an eight year period. Mary also instructed self-defense classes to trauma victims. After moving to Bend, OR she continued to teach classes in Taekwondo for Cobra System Martial Arts.

Here she was also active in the local farmer's market where she sold eggs, lip balm and trees (interesting combination) at the first farmer's market in Bend. Mary also became involved with the Bend school district and taught tie-dye as part of their extra curriculum program to all the elementary children in the district.

From Bend, she and Aaron, her husband, moved to Gold Beach. (See last month's profile article in the July *Riffle* on Aaron). Her life continues to develop with new work experiences. Here she has worked as a legal assistant for several years and continues to make jewelry. Currently her jewelry is on display at the Wedderburn Store. She likes to collect river rocks to use as the center focal piece for her jewelry.

Mary is also an active volunteer with the fish hatchery. She spends her time feeding in the raceways, helping with fundraisers and special events, and helping kids fish at Arizona Beach and Libby Pond.

Both are currently getting ready to become fishing instructors for ODFW.


