By the way, when I left the bay, I want to let you know that no fish were harmed or injured, even my anchovy came out of the water in the same condition as when I started!

CAF General Meeting

Aug. 8, 2013

David Sophusson, president, called the meeting to order at 10:08am. A film crew from Germany contacted David about the possibility of filming an educational segment on the hatchery as they come down the Oregon coast in late August. They will be in touch with David. There have been many tours this summer and maybe CAF clothing items should be available for sale to tour groups.

<u>Treasurer's report-</u> Barbara Jorge reported a July gain of \$10,498.17 and bank balance of \$22,553.93. Our grants accounting is now complete. There hasn't been any activity in the Combs Memorial account, but a second letter will be sent to the schools in late September soliciting proposals for projects meeting the fund's criteria. The fireworks booth raised \$1,905.53. Becky Sophusson will no longer do the bookkeeping after this year and Barbara will take on that responsibility. We really appreciate Becky's handling that position and helping Barbara get acquainted with our financial reporting.

Derby- Chairman, Mike Kopec, reported that advertising posters have been printed and are ready for distribution. There will be 2 raffle boards with prizes of interest to women. Dean Hendricks of North County Lures has donated derby prizes of a variety fishing gear and several boxes of his own brand lures that CAF can sell for fundraising. The CAF board is contemplating the designation of a raceway recognizing Dean as a major sponsor of CAF. The Saturday night dinner/raffle/awards function will be held at the old Mail Boats barn with a local vendor providing food for sale.

<u>Hatchery-</u> Vice president, Gary Underhill, said the release of fish from raceway 2 went very well and the increased water flow to the remaining raceways has noticeably improved. The vault screen has been repaired by Freeman Marine. The source of the problem at the vault on July 4th has not been identified. The DO system will be wired into the alarm.

ODFW- John Weber was very pleased with the health of the fish that were released. The samples of the fish that were sent for pathology verified that the volunteers are doing a great job caring for the fish. John was very in complimentary of the extreme dedication of several members that have put in countless hours to assure that the hatchery runs smoothly. Membership chairperson needed- Hassie Taylor was in charge of membership when she was treasurer and continued that job when she left the board and took over as editor of The Riffle. She will relinquish the membership responsibility at the end of the year and we will need a replacement. Thanks, Hassie, for doing a great job!

BOARD MEMBERS- The present 8 board members have agreed to seek reelection and we have one volunteer that would like to be elected for the remaining vacant position. Any other volunteers that would like to join the board please speak to one of the board members.

I know Mike Kopec, Harry Carlson & Diane Kellogg have been collecting some great items for the raffle boards & auction. Volunteer of the Month Profile Hassie Taylor

I am the product of an immigrant family who was seeking a better life across the Atlantic in the 1950's. My parents didn't have a sponsor for direct passage into the U.S., so my father took a job in Canada and my mother and I followed a half year later. We lived in Ontario for a couple of years. Then my father landed a job in Ohio where we spent a winter and from Ohio we loaded up a U-Haul and drove west to California.

Raised and educated in Manhattan Beach, I left to finish college in Sacramento and taught school in a neighboring suburb for almost thirty vears. As a teacher I taught every grade except first and second. I tend to get bored quickly, so it's exciting for me to enter new terrain. During my teaching career I spearheaded several programs in the district including a writing program for students who were struggling with composition, Arts in the Classrooms Program where I served as the liaison between our schools in the district and the county coordinating parent volunteers to come into the schools and present art history with a follow-up hands-on art project to the students grades K-6. I was the queen of theater. My 4th-5th combination class presented Shakespeare's "Romeo and Juliet." It was a smashing success! I taught a unit in stocks and my class won the Sacramento Bee completion one year. During my last five years I mentored student teachers. There's more, but let's not bore the reader.

Then it happened: while on Spring Break in 2004. My husband and I traveled around Oregon and found a small chalet overlooking the Pacific. That same day we made an offer on the fixer-upper which is now our home. It was was an emotional spur-of-the-moment decision. But somehow, it just seemed right. So we returned home and my husband was in charge of selling our house in Fair Oaks. We had agreed to a ninety day escrow. At that time, Bob was capable of selling ice to an Eskimo. So, of course, he found a buyer while I was sweating bullets. The following two years were spent making our house a home.

I decided to gradually transition my way out of the educational system by substitute teaching in Gold Beach and Brookings.

In June of 2008, I made the decision to give time for volunteer work. I was soon introduced to Chris Underhill at the annual Hatcherv Fundraiser Dinner. The next thing I knew, I was in the thick of it, taking care of salmon eggs and becoming involved in the spawning process. I soon discovered that the spirits of all those salmon that my classes raised in the classroom while teaching fifth grade in Sacramento were calling me. Mentored by Susan Kopec, I found that becoming a "spermintor" is great fun as well as a huge responsibility, and to this day, it remains my favorite activity at the hatchery. I'm already looking forward to the upcoming season. I have also served as membership chair, treasurer, and, of course, editor of The Riffle.

Some of my other interests include activities such as swimming, downhill skiing, biking, hiking and yoga. I love to travel and have been fortunate to see much of the world, partly because my mother lives in Germany. For many years, I would fly to Germany and from there travel with my mother to other parts of the world. On a final note, I can only say that living in Gold Beach has fulfilled a part of my dream – to live by the ocean.

There was lots of action going on in Gold Beach.

An' there's a couple of joints as tough as any frontier dive ever was. They're a hard crowd, these fishermen. Seafarin' men from Portland an' Seattle. Canucks from Puget Sound half-breeds from the Cascades. Coast fishermen from Crescent. From May til October first, Gold Beach is sure prosperous." P.43

Board Member wanted for 2014. Tom Tostenson has stepped down from the board and this leaves a vacancy.


