General Meeting

April 12, 2012

<u>David Sophusson</u>, president, called the meeting to order at 10:05 am. The minutes of last month's meeting were approved as printed in *The Riffle*. David noted that some hoses have disappeared from the hatchery and he will make mention of that in his column.

<u>Treasurer's report-</u> In the absence of Mike Kopec, David reported a March loss of \$640.54 and a month end bank balance of \$21,584.85.

<u>Hatchery-</u> Vice president, Gary Underhill, has ordered 3 new feeders and some feeder repair parts. All raceways have been vacuumed to remove the sludge/silt and the daily volunteers will be asked to resume vacuuming.

Memorial Donation- Mike Kopec received an email from Cynthia Cooper mentioning that her mother, Dorothy Combs, had passed away at 101 yrs. old. The Combs have had a cabin on the Rogue River since the 30's. Cynthia and her brother David are interested in possibly setting up a memorial fund supporting CAF involvement in elementary education. Glenn has been in contact and is working on the idea.

Information Kiosk- Jim Freedman presented the current details on the kiosk across the road from Indian Creek Café. The Lower Rogue Watershed Council (LRWC) is going to seek a grant to repair and update the kiosk and is coordinating the participation by numerous groups. As one of the organizations to be involved, CAF is being asked to contribute some matching funds toward the estimated \$11,000 cost. MOTION- by Gary Underhill, second by Randy Waters that CAF commit \$500 in matching funds for the grant. Motion approved.

GUESTS- Joan Goodison introduced 3 guests that may be interested in becoming volunteers. We welcomed Gary Barton and Nancy and Bill O'Connor.

OLD BUSINESS- In January of 2009 Ron Schwarz began attending meetings as the CAF committee representative of a forecast 6-month commitment to draft the Rouge Fall Chinook Species Management Unit Conservation Plan. For the past 38 months and 22 meetings Ron has accumulated 3-1/2 notebooks of data that resulted in a completed plan to first present for public review and then to the commissioners in Salem. The goal of the plan is to provide

guidelines to ODFW to preserve the wild Chinook runs from Euchre Creek to the OR/CA boarder. The governor has appointed the commission members and Ron is hopeful they will approve the 250-page plan. Ron feels the final plan was well worth his time. Everyone at the meeting applauded Ron's commitment of his time and expense to a necessary plan that may ultimately save Indian Creek Hatchery. Ron thanked past president Mike Kopec for asking Ron to be our representative.

Volunteer of the Month Profile Bo Gemeinhart

Bo graduated from Carpinteria High School, located just south of Santa Barbara and went on to attend Cal Poly San Luis Obispo majoring in horticulture with a minor in math. While attending college, Bo worked for Chevron on weekends and then worked as a psychology technician at the Atascadero State Hospital for the criminally insane administering medication and, "...did stuff you don't really want to know about." These technicians were known to put the fear of God into these patients.

After college, Bo got married and volunteered for the draft in the US Army. His wife encouraged him to get out after two years of service. He then worked for the State of California as a correctional officer for the administration of justice and put time in with Soledad Prison (meant to be a pun).
