

President's Corner

General Meeting

June 14, 2012

Mike Kopec- called the meeting to order at 10:05am. The minutes of last month's meeting were approved as printed in The Riffle. Mike reminded the members that the Salmon Trout Advisory Committee (STAC) will have their meeting in Brookings on the 22^{nd} and will visit the hatchery the next day. Mike explained that the members of the committee are statewide volunteers appointed by the governor. The meeting is open to the public and the Indian Creek Hatchery Propagation Proposal will be discussed at 11:20am. Chris Underhill will make a presentation on behalf of CAF. It would be beneficial to have member representation from CAF. Todd Confer and John Weber will answer committee questions on behalf of our local ODFW, but CAF should also be prepared to answer questions. Saturday at the hatchery, CAF will give the committee a tour and provide a potluck lunch.

Mike read a letter from member and longtime volunteer, Becky Ross, expressing concern from the Brewfest organizers about the conflicting date of the Brewfest and the CAF sponsored Salmon Derby. Mike read information from the current Oregon Stewardship newsletter regarding scholarships and accomplishments.

Treasurer's report- Mike Kopec reported a gain of \$3,333.84 for the month of May and a month end bank balance \$26,595.60. There were

restricted contributions of \$2,000 from David Combs and \$1,000 from Termo Co. to the Dorothy and Eldredge Combs Memorial Fund. The board and treasurer have decided to maintain a separate account for the Combs fund. The board has appointed a committee (John Epps, Jim Freedman, and Glenn Kral) to suggest donations meeting the goals of the Combs fund.

<u>Fireworks-</u> Mike presented the work schedule of volunteers staffing the sales trailer.

<u>Salmon Derby-</u> The major organization for the derby is in place and Mike has a list of volunteer positions required for the CAF portions of the derby. Mike will have all derby information in the next Riffle.

Hatchery- Mike reported that Gary Underhill strained his back at the beginning of fin clipping and 2 great volunteers, Harry Carlson and Patrick Eakles, stepped up to handle Gary's many jobs. Pat was awarded a Rogue River trip courtesy of Jerry's Rogue Jets along with lunch on the trip compliments of The Rogue Outdoor Store.

Wow! This has been one crazy June at Indian Creek Hatchery, my heads a spinning, I hear your thoughts Glen, when isn't my head spinning HA HA. We fin clipped May 29th to June 1st, that's were we clip off the adipose fin, this marks them as a hatchery fish. The adipose fin is the little fin between the dorsal fin and the tail fin, and when the fish is only 4 to 5 inches long, that's a really tiny fin. Thank goodness we get to put the little fish or fry asleep before we clip them, makes the whole process a whole lot easier

Well it took 59 volunteers, 3 1/2 days or 495 man hours, to clip a total of 83,531 Chinook salmon fry. I think that's an awesome display of teamwork, we have a great group of CAF volunteers and Gold Beach volunteers. recruited a few fishing guides to help, and even met a couple at the Redwood Theatre in Brookings and told them what we do, and they called me to help with extra volunteers from Turtle Rock RV Park where they were all staying. Did I mention that my husband, who is my main man each morning to set up and crowd fish, pulled a muscle in his back the first hour of the first day, it wasn't pretty, but you volunteers jumped up to the plate and came forward to help, thank you to all, with an extra big Thank You to Pat Eakles and Harry Carlson, who came every morning to setup and get the ball rolling. Have a few 7th graders who wish to help out at the hatchery, Austin Williams & Taylor Bright and they helped clip fish, then showed up bright

and early the last morning and helped Bo do the morning feeding and chores. The boys did a great job and Bo gave them great reviews! We weed whacking at Libby Pond getting ready for the derby, the creek had totally changed, so the meadow by the Rod & Gun Club is now the creek and mushy wet. I thought I'd try and make a path to the island, WRONG, I was knee deep in water and laughing at myself - left that for the kids who really wanted to fish there. Wouldn't you know Austin & Taylor and their brothers were the boys that really wanted to fish the island, they got a little wet, but they are determined boys, when it comes to fishing. Did you know this was the 24th annual Kid's Libby Pond Fishing Derby? Well, it was, and each year it grows larger with a record breaking 113 kids registered for this year's fishing derby. We had 14 volunteers from CAF, ODFW, USFS & OSCF prepared to help and they measured 261 trout and cooked and served 223 hot dogs, great job guys!

The day started bright and early, with excited kids, ready to register and start fishing, and a nice muddy parking lot, it was going to be a day of fun! Once again, we had the Brookings Cub & Boy Scouts fishing and fisherkids from Gold Beach, Brookings, Pt. Orford and even a few from Nampa & Payette, Idaho.

This years derby was a little different because we didn't have any of the larger fish we call Lunkers, they had contracted Copepods, and they attack the gills and eventually suffocate the fish, so, no Lunkers this year.

We had an extremely close derby this year with the Biggest Fish measuring 290 mm going to 11 yr old Devin Wolford from Gold Beach. I've been doing this derby for 12 yrs now, and I remember Devin winning biggest fish when he was 4 yrs old and the fish was as long, as he was tall. Devin won a Lamiglas fishing rod & Jerry's gift cert., all of the winners got fishing rods, ribbons, Sweetbriar's Chocolate Fish and more.

We started with the 0-5 year olds 3rd Place River Harris, 5, Brookings, won Ocean World passes, 2nd Place Jayden Kay, Gold Beach, won Prehistoric Gardens Family Pass and 1st Place went to Raina Harris, 2, Brookings, who won a Gary Combs Memorial Fishing Rod, Curry Fair pass & bracelet & a Cabela's Life Preserver & bag. Next we had the 6-9 year olds and 3rd Place was Peyton Armentrout, 9, Gold Beach, he won Ocean World passes, 2nd Place went to Tori Sandquist, 8, from Payette, Idaho won West Coast Game Park Passes and 1st Place went to Daniella Marshall, 9, Gold Beach, who received a Gary Combs Memorial Rod, Fair pass & bracelet, and a Super Soaker.

Lastly, we had the 10-14 year olds 3rd Place was Laurie Buehler, 13, Brookings, and 2nd Place Darren Bright, 10, Gold Beach, both won Big 5 gift cert., movie and pool passes, and 1st Place went to Kaidan Murrey, 10, Brookings, who received a Gary Combs Memorial Rod, Fair pass & bracelet, Cabela's Multi Tool Knife & bag and Redwood Movie Pass.

Volunteer of the Month Profile John Epps

I was born in Kirksville, MO in 1937 and raised in Temple City, CA (a suburb of Pasadena and Los Angeles). I graduated Pasadena High School in 1955 and then attended Pasadena City College and Orange Coast College with majors in business administration and engineering. In 1959 Marianne and I married and are still married after fifty-three years. We have two children and four grandchildren. We settled in San Diego in 1961 and lived there until moving to Gold Beach in 2004.

I started my working career in the pharmaceutical industry by working part time as a pharmacy technician while going to school. I've worked in a drug store, wholesale drug distributor, and then as an outside salesman (detail man) for the Stuart Company of Pasadena selling vitamins and then eighteen years for Bristol –Squibb in Orange County and San Diego County as a specialist selling antibiotics and anticancer drugs to hospitals, wholesalers, and pharmacies.

After twenty-five years in the pharmaceutical industry I tired of the large corporate world experience and decided to try something new. So, having been an avid hobbyist with saltwater tropical fish for a number of years, Marianne and I decided to open our own tropical fish store in San Diego. We sold both wholesale and retail. Our store soon became the largest saltwater fish store in San Diego County and one of the top 5 in CA. Because saltwater fish have special chemistry and tank requirements, I spent many years experimenting with different types of systems to reduce mortality. At that time the standard for all wholesales and retailers was to use individual, each with its own filter, heater, etc. This method is totally unsatisfactory and has now been replaced worldwide with what's called a "Closed Recirculating System." I am proud of the fact that I was one of the first in the nation to design and successfully use this new type of system over thirty-five years ago.

Because of the success with my Closed Recirculating System, I was asked by many other wholesalers and retailers to design similar systems for them and sell them the appropriate equipment. To take advantage of this new "niche" market, I formed a new corporation called Aqunetics Systems, Inc. in San Diego in 1975.

Over a period of 35 years, Aquanetics Systems grew to over 65 employees with a 30,000 sq. ft. building, and over 5,000 products. We manufactured and distributed specialty products for aquaculture and aquarium systems with capacities to 5 million gallons. We built customers worldwide and did a significant business with research institutions, public aquariums, zoos, and universities as well as many products for the wholesale and retail tropical fish trade. We sold Aquanetics in 2001 and retired to beautiful Gold Beach in 2004.

My hobbies are golf, boating, model railroad design and aquatic system design. I have enjoyed working with CAF because of the people, the challenge and the "fuzzy" feeling I get at release time! Besides, it helps to keep me young and useful.
