General Meeting

April 14, 2011

<u>President-</u> David Sophusson called the meeting to order at 10:05 am. The minutes of the last meeting were approved as distributed.

<u>Treasurer-</u> Hassie Taylor gave the March financial statement showing a balance of \$12,047; CAF showed an income of \$304.96 and expenses of \$6,980.43 resulting in a loss of \$6,975.47 for the month. Our big expense item this month was the fish pump in the amount of \$6,020.25. Gary will work on getting a receipt for the feeder stands.

<u>Hatchery</u> – It was mentioned that Glenn Kral is working on getting the hose ordered which will cost approximately \$630.00. Shipping for the hose should be around the end of May.

The mini-grant for the dip nets was approved for \$1,300 although the actual cost may be around \$1,400. Gary mentioned that the maintenance at the hatchery looks good. There is no built-up of sand in the raceways. The vacuum pumps are working fine. The fish are feeding well although raceway three is feeding about halfway down. The fish are currently a little above last year's weight gain and we have a below average count on morts.

Volunteer coordinator- Chris Underhill discussed the Arizona Beach activities set for April. She is still looking for volunteers to help with the kids and the day's activities. Volunteers for Sunday fish feeding are also being sought. Chris also announced that the CAF brochures need updating.

Miscellaneous- In addition to updating the brochures, CAF also needs to redesign our page that runs in the "Visitor's Guide" by the end of May. Philip Dickson will work on the updates. It was reported that CAF receives approximately 46,000 hits a month on the *Curry Reporter's* link. The idea of selling tee-shirts on the website was also entertained.

Hassie has agreed to attempt to put out *The Riffle*. Since there are new rules in place for non-profit mailings with the post office and only 1/4 of the contents can be devoted to

advertisement, we now need to fill an extra page in *The Riffle*. Hassie is encouraging volunteers to write a little paragraph about themselves; one or two volunteer profiles will be published monthly. CAF is happy that Gene Trinkler has graciously agreed to do the May write-up. The meeting was adjourned at 10:57am

Hatchery Happenings

Everything at the hatchery is looking great! The fish are looking healthy. Bill Fetzer weighed them on the 15th and the results are as follows: Raceway #1 is 123 per lb., Raceway #2 is at 146 per lb., and the babies in Raceway #3 are 176 per lb. We have four automatic feeders on each raceway and are hand-feeding each morning around 9:00 a.m. and every evening around 5:00 p.m. I'm very happy Bill Fetzer is back. He's been sharing the PM feedings and food measuring with me, and he's managing the fish food and keeping track of fish growth. Glad you're back, Bill!

If you are a daily feeder at the hatchery, please try to be there around 9:00 a.m. so that the automatic feeders are done by the time we do the evening hand-feed. You might also notice while hand-feeding that not all the raceways are feeding on the top. Don't panic, keep watching, and you'll see them feeding about half-way down. This is normal because the food is heavier and drops quicker, but it's not as much fun for the feeder who likes to watch them rise to the top to feed. Also, please check the vacuuming schedule. On the day you are scheduled, scrub down the walls and vacuum your assigned raceway. Right now we are vacuuming a raceway every two days, but this will change, as the fish get bigger. On April 20th we started the Reel Fishing Days

On April 20" we started the Reel Fishing Days at Arizona Beach. This program teaches 3rd graders from Gold Beach, Brookings, and Pt. Orford how to fish. This was day one of four days. We had about 20 fish caught by 24 delighted Pt. Orford 3rd graders. We were lucky that it didn't rain on us. We hope tomorrow's weather will cooperate with the 50 Gold Beach students we're expecting.

It was noted today by Bo that I'm always fashionable late (5-10 minutes), but I arrived with food for all and I even included hot coffee. I want to thank all the volunteers who helped out with the fishing days. It was a great time had by most. There might have been a few frustrating moments or thoughts of, "Why did I volunteer for this?" The answer to that question is simple. It's because you're a good person who's gluten for punishment, just like me! I love it! Thank you so much for being patient with the kids and teaching them to fish!




