

#### **Hatchery Happenings**

It's clipping time! The clipping trailer arrived last Monday, the 16th, but we won't start clipping until around May 25th; let the fry have one more week to gain some size. Last week all raceways were between 65 and 85 fry per pound. They should be good size for clipping. Clipping is how we mark hatchery fish. Removing the adipose fin that is located between the dorsal fin and the tail fin does this. In the clipping process we bucket the fry into the clipping trailer where there are four clipping stations with holding bins. Ten to fifteen fry are netted at a time and put to sleep (medicated). Then the volunteer clippers snip off the little fin and drop it down the shoot that returns them to their same raceway. takes them a few minutes to fully wake up, and then off they go like nothing happened.

This month we also had about sixty 5th graders from Riley Creek and Pt. Orford Elementary Schools at the hatchery for National Resource Day, May 12th. There were seven different stations from the dam vault to the mouth of Indian Creek. Bill Budd and I represented the hatchery. We did our picture board presentation and then let each group feed the fish. It was a nice sunny day and thank goodness the turkeys stayed away. We did hear them a few times but think they knew they were out-numbered.

I'd also like to thank everyone who helped out at Arizona Beach Reel Days. We taught seven 3rd grade classes, approximately 210 students from Brookings, Riley Creek, and Pt. Orford. Mike Kopec said they cleaned 91 fish in two days. Thank you to Rod Black, Mike Becker, Mike Kopec, BJ Waters and Val Early for cleaning a lot of fish and doing a fantastic job! If I missed any cleaners I apologize; you all know my blondness. Kudos to the many volunteers who helped out - Dixie Boley, Angie McCloskey, Bo Gemeinhardt, Denny Evans, Ken White, David Sophusson, Dean Pollen, Bill Budd, Mark Hollinger, Glenn Kral, Jock Headlee, Fred Notestine, Jack Chaille, Vern Tarwater, John Wilson, Debbie Wilson, Randy and BJ Waters, Rod Black, Gary and Chris Underhill, OSCF Tony Hobbs, Ken Range, Dave Brown, Paul LeFebvre, Monty Moncrief, Jerry Kemper and STAC Rep. Rich Heap and ODFW Joev Denbo. Steve Messur, Weber and all the high school student volunteers. The volunteers did a great job and left impressions on those kids that will last a lifetime. Thank you.

June 11th is Libby Pond Fishing Derby. We start setting up at 7 AM by the old gun club. The derby runs from 8:00 AM-12:00PM. We hope to get some volunteers together to make fishing spots at Libby Pond. We need a weed-whacker brigade. Any volunteers?

#### **General Meeting**

May 12, 2011

<u>David Sophusson</u>, president, called the meeting to order at 10:02a.m. The minutes of last month's meeting were approved as printed in *The Riffle*.

Treasurer's report- In the absence of treasurer, Hassie Taylor, Becky Sophusson reported the monthly gain of \$23,298.40 and an end of month balance of \$35,350.67. The figures reflect the receipt of the STEP funds for the fish pump, which won't be delivered until the end of May. A discussion ensued about the charges for electricity, which includes a surcharge of \$70/month due to the horsepower rating of the emergency pumps.

<u>Salmon Derby-</u> Mike Kopec explained that Lex's Landing will not be hosting any derbies this year. It's possible that the derby can be held at Jot's Resort. David Sophusson and Tom Tostenson will meet with Jot's to discuss what arrangements can be made. Jeff Ferguson from the visitor's center is ready to help with advertising again. The date is September 24<sup>th</sup>, so Mike has had discussions with Jim Carey of the Rogue Outdoor Store about coordinating with the proposed interest from the Western Outdoor News (WON).

<u>Volunteer</u> <u>Coordinator</u> Chris Underhill reported on Reel Days, Natural Resource Day, work needed at the hatchery, fin clipping at the end of the month, a volunteer to help Hassie with *The Riffle* and Kid's Fishing Day at Libby Pond on June 11<sup>th</sup>.

<u>Clothing-</u> Mike has been working with the supplier on a new design for our hatchery clothing. The board has approved the redesign and Mike will get quotes, so the order can be approved in time for the new season.

Miscellaneous- Philip Dickson contacted *The Reporter* about rewriting our article for the upcoming Visitor's Guide. There's a chance the hatchery could be featured on the cover. Our brochure could use some updating and Philip will talk to Laurel Gerkman about helping with that. The Middle Rogue Steelheaders have requested a list of needs at the hatchery that they might be willing to fund. David has checked with various members and will send a list and thank them for their generous offer to help. The board approved the \$109 expense to have the

oxygen monitoring system repaired.

# Volunteer Profile of the Month: Philip Dickson


