

Well, we had another great fin clipping session this year. With thanks to all the volunteers and their nimble fingers, we managed to clip over 80,000 itty-bitty fins in less than 3 ½ days! I believe Chris will have more details on this in her column.

Our new fish pump is now in Roseburg and should be here soon. We purchased a new pump that actually sucks the smolts out of the raceways and will pump them into the transport truck to deliver them to the river for release. In the past we have used dip nets to transfer the smolts to the transport truck. Unfortunately, by using dip nets, the smolts lose a lot of their scales and each scale lost is a possible site to get infected and might cause their death. We have a lot of new technology in place, and our volunteers work hard to raise healthy fish to give them the best possible chance for survival at their release. This new pump is another step toward our goal in raising the percentage rate for returning adult salmon each year.

Our fireworks have arrived. Becky is currently making up the work schedule for volunteers to run the fireworks booth. If you haven't been called but are able to put in 3-4 hours for a shift for one day or more, Becky would love to hear from you. 541-247-9739

## **Hatchery Happenings**

FISH CLIPPING – I am very happy to report that we clipped 81,420 fish in three days and 2 hours. It took a total of 40 volunteers and 350 man-hours to complete this task, and it was done with minimal lose of fish (less than 100). I say, "AWESOME JOB!" Thank you Bo for taking over for me on Tuesday when I woke up sick; you were a lifesaver.

We've decided we should sell all the little fins from the clipping trailer and Rich Watson came up with the new cereals name, "Adipostee's." Look for it on your grocery shelf in about ten more years when we have enough fins to fill a box.

You should see some of these guys clipping with fins flying everywhere, even into my hair. We have a few clippers, friends of the Fetzer's, who came in from California. They clipped over 1,300 fish every two hours.

You know clipping isn't an easy job. It's very tedious and glasses are usually required, but all volunteers stepped up to the plate and knocked it out. LIBBY POND - The 23rd Annual Libby Pond Fishing Derby started out early Saturday, June 11th. It was overcast and chilly with a light mist, but that didn't deter our young fisherpersons and their families. We had a record breaking 101 boys and girls enter this year's fishing derby. I've never wished a pond could grow bigger so bad in my life. Lo and behold, it all worked out and everyone had a great time! There were kids of all ages, many with their grandparents enjoying this great fishing day. We had kids from Gold Beach, Brookings, Crescent City, Medford, Mapleton, Tucson, Arizona and even a few kids from Stanford, Montana who were visiting their Gold Beach grandparents. There were at least twenty first timers who had never fished before, but we were prepared for them with the ODFW Youth Anglers & Aquatic Trailer & Instructors who

provided bait, fishing rods, and even taught the kids how to fish. Thank you Rod Black, Jock Headlee, Tony Hobbs and Tom Olsen for helping with the kids! I was over by the Rod & Gun Club, but I could hear the children's squeals of excitement and laughter across the pond, and that's what it's all about - great memories, spending time with the family and being outdoors!

Prior to the derby, Libby Pond was stocked with 5,000 rainbow trout and a 150 "lunkers" or Trophy Trout that weigh between 3-5 lbs. each. At noon on Saturday, I blew the horn to end the derby and the kids brought their fish to be measured. We had volunteers on hand from Curry Anadromous Fishermen (CAF), Oregon South Coast Fishermen (OSCF), Oregon Dept. of Fish & Wildlife (ODFW), and the U.S. Forestry Service. They all helped measure fish, tally score sheets and handled whatever was thrown their way. While everyone waited for the final tally, CAF members Gary Underhill, Bo Gemeinhardt, Pat Eakle, Mike Kopec and Gary Harmon provided lemonade, chips, and cookies. They cooked more than 200 hot dogs, all donated by CAF & Western Family to feed all the derby participants and families.

Many nice fish were caught, but only 10 lunkers were landed during the fishing derby.

DAILY FEEDERS – Remember to check the Daily Feeding Schedule to see which raceway needs to be cleaned on your day. The fish now range 40 - 50 to a pound. We need to keep the raceways as clean as possible so the oxygen level stays up. The DO Meters are now working at the end of each raceway. The raceway key opens the DO box. Write down the OXY count on each raceway. The thermometers are at the end of the raceways. One temperature reading is sufficient for all raceways. Make a little note in the notebook of all you did so everyone knows what's been done.

## **General Meeting**

June 9, 2011

<u>David Sophusson</u>, president, called the meeting to order at 10:02am. The minutes of last month's meeting were approved as printed in *The Riffle*.

Treasurer's reportHassie Taylor reported the monthly loss of \$1,193.43 and an end of month balance of \$34,157.24. The figures reflect the receipt of the STEP funds for the fish pump, which has been delivered to ODFW in Roseburg. The pump payment will be in the June report. No adjustments will be made for the electric billing.

Salmon Derby- Mike Kopec is working with Jim Carey (Rogue Outdoor Store), Jeff Ferguson (Gold Beach Promotions Committee) and Western Outdoor News (WON) to hold a 5 day derby that will benefit CAF and the Sea Lion Patrol. The idea is to conduct an annual derby in the lower Rogue River in early September when our Indian Creek Hatchery fish are returning. With the cooperation of the above 4 entities, Mike expects we will have a great deal of promotion, advertising and prizes that will attract a broad participation from the western states. Philip Dickson suggested we look into protecting the name as 'intellectual property'.

Volunteer Coordinator- Chris Underhill gave the final numbers on the fin clipping: 3 days, 350 volunteer hours and 81,420 fish clipped with minimal mortalities (fish or volunteers). Not all feeder volunteers are able to brush and vacuum, so Chris is working the schedule around to make sure the raceways are vacuumed twice weekly. Fish are growing ahead of schedule and are feeding very well. Libby Pond is on June 11 and CAF will provide \$100 towards prizes and food, as well as workers.

<u>Clothing-</u> Mike has received the newly designed T-shirts and they are stunning! The shirts will be available for sale at the fireworks stand. Mike will give each volunteer at the fireworks stand a shirt from last year's derby. Philip Dickson will talk to his wife, Pam, about being the clothing coordinator.

Fireworks- Becky Sophusson has all the plans in place to begin sales on June 25<sup>th</sup> or 26<sup>th</sup>. Many more volunteers are needed and Philip will conduct a reminder campaign via the Rogue Outdoor Store. The Mat Club is back to selling this year.

<u>Miscellaneous-</u> Hassie read some of the highlights from the latest edition of the Oregon Stewardship newsletter. A proposed, revised brochure has been received from Laurel Gerkman and is being reviewed.

<u>Raffle-</u> Katie may not be able to do the raffle anymore, but we won't replace her just yet.


