

#### **Presidents Corner**

All fry are out in the raceways and appear to be eating and doing well. John Weber has indicated that the fish are growing well and the first two raceways are being feeder feed along with hand feeding. I would like to take the opportunity to give a big thanks to Chris and Gary Underhill for all the time and effort they have given in taking care of the eggs, setting feeding schedules along with feeding, etc. A pat on the back is deserved for a job well done.

Now that the fish are in the raceways Bill Fetzer will be a primary contact, but Chris and Gary will still be fully involved. The new D.O. system is up and running so there is no need to use the old handheld DO meter. The meter was placed into operation with a lot of help from David and continuously rotates readings from all three raceways. ID #1 is for raceway #1, etc. It will display three readings and the DO reading needed is the second reading listed. This will be followed by a screen displaying the temperature in Celsius. You may convert the Celsius reading or get the temperature from the thermometers at the end of the raceways. Thanks David for all your help in getting this up and running. The grant for the aeration system has been approved and we should be receiving funds in the not to distant future. We look forward to getting the system installed. This will allow us to hold the fish longer and allow them to get larger before releasing. We will be needing volunteers to help fill in the feeding schedule. Also, some volunteer(s) may require assistance in vacuuming or brushing raceway side since this will be starting in the near future. The

general meeting at the fairgrounds was a big success and there was plenty of good food and conversation. I Would like to thank the Mayor for his attendance and remarks. The fund raising committee has come up with several good ideas for raising funds and is proceeding forward. A big thanks to the group for their time and effort in helping the organization raise needed funds.

#### **General Meeting**

March11, 2010

Bo Gemeinhardt, vice president, called the meeting to order at 10am. Tom Tostenson is doing very well after his quadruple bypass surgery in Medford on Mar. 8<sup>th</sup>. Bo introduced Mayor Jim Wernicke as our special guest.

The Mayor talked about first coming to Gold Beach in 1976 and returning yearly after that. It was at the Indian Creek campgrounds that Jim was first introduced to the life cycle of the Chinook salmon through the hatchbox on the back porch of the main building. Jim spoke of the unbelievable challenges faced by salmon to successfully complete their cycle. He spoke with great admiration of the salmon's tenacity to meet those challenges and complimented the CAF volunteers with having similar tenacity in their successful operation of the Indian Creek Hatchery. Jim praised the volunteers for their important contribution to the community of Gold Beach.

Hassie Taylor explained the treasurer's report, which showed a gain of \$30 for the month of Feb. and a bank balance of \$15,935.

The fundraising committee meeting was attended by 10 members and they produced a list of 16 possible ideas for the year. In Becky Sophusson's absence, Sue Kopec reviewed the list, explained which ideas the committee eliminated and detailed the benefits of the ideas the committee favored. After a discussion by the members, Sue called for motions for the floor to approve those ideas which the committee should pursue in order of preference by the membership.

**MOTION-** by Joan Goodison, seconded by John Epps; sponsor the 11<sup>th</sup> annual salmon dinner in August in conjunction with a fishing derby, either ours or an already scheduled one. Motion passed.

MOTION- by Bill Fetzer, second by Gil Davis; Gil Davis will assess the details for a Golf Tournament and possible dinner to be held in early September before the 25<sup>th</sup>. Motion passed.

MOTION- by Chris Underhill, second by John Lento; the committee will choose one or more of the proposed raffles (food or destination). Motion passed.

MOTION- by Lennie Forkas, second by Kate DeBord; the committee will work with Rich Watson on the details for selling a hatchery oriented calendar. Motion passed.

Chris Underhill, the temporary volunteer coordinator, reported that all 82,000 fish are now in the raceways. Some of the mechanical feeders have been set out, but some fish will still receive hand feeding. Chris has been very about making sure the feeders diligent understand their responsibilities and will be very clear with the updated instructions in the office. John Weber will be involved in scheduled training sessions for ALL volunteers. There will be the grade school angler education program at Arizona Beach in April and Chris will let everyone know about the dates and times. ODFW expects to conduct free fishing day at Libby Pond in June.

Mike & Sue Kopec will represent CAF at Port Orford's Water Festival.

The minutes for the Feb meeting were approved as printed in *The Riffle* except for the heading designation of "Annual" instead of February. There were 30 people having the pre meeting breakfast at our new meeting place and everyone was pleased enough to agree to continue having our meetings there. Thank you to the Friends of the Fair for all their effort in support of the County Fairgrounds.

Kate DeBord nervously conducted a very successful raffle!
