

Things are going very well at the hatchery right now. Our new storage building looks great. It's going to be nice to have a secure dry place to store our equipment. We recently had a work party to put the new liner in raceway #3. It took about 10 of us to haul it into the raceway and position it. Now we just have to smooth out the wrinkles, reattach the railings, and put back in the channels for the divider screens.

ODF&W has started collecting brood stock to spawn with our naturally returning hatchery stock. Hopefully, Mother Nature will be kinder to us this year and bring some rain, but not the torrential flooding that we had last year that cut our production in half.

During one of the hatchery tours, we were asked if we had any DVD's showing the spawning process and raising fish. Well, we don't, but thought it was a great idea. So, we bought a video camera and are now making a video that will cover the entire process from beginning to end. Of course, this is going to take awhile but, hopefully, in the end, we will have a presentation that will be educational and informative to the public about just what we do at our hatchery.

### **CAF General Meeting**

September 14, 2017

<u>Call to Order</u>-President, David Sophusson, called the meeting to order at 10:05am. The minutes from the June, July and August meetings were approved as published in the Sept. edition of *The Riffle*.

<u>Treasurer-</u>Barbara Huff reported a monthly profit of \$9,729.06 and a year to date profit of \$923.88.

**<u>2017</u>** Derby-Thanks to Mary Duncan's commitment, the derby profit was \$9,129.

**Hatchery-**Gary Underhill reported: raceway #3 liner will be replaced before we need to use the raceway; the sediment has been removed from the holding tank; the old storage shed will be taken away by Aaron Duncan; brood stock collection begins on Oct. 1<sup>st</sup>; the incubator room needs to be cleaned; rats are becoming a bigger problem.

**Ray's Market Receipts-**We need more members to enroll in the All Access Program or they will discontinue our donations. Members can enroll at the store.

**DVD-**A tourist met Gene Trinkler at Sunset Pizza and suggested that we make a DVD of a year's worth of activity at the hatchery and use it for a promotional item. The board will discuss the idea.

<u>**Pizza Fundraiser-</u>**Barbara Jorge volunteered to talk to the owner of Sunset Pizza about setting a night for Indian Creek Hatchery.</u>

**Election/General Meeting-**The annual meeting needs to be held in December. It was decided to hold the meeting on Dec. 9<sup>th</sup>. Barbara Huff will talk to the new owners of HoneyBear, Jack Sheehan will talk to the owner at Chowder House and Glenn Kral will talk to the manager at Turtle Rock RV.

**Board Member nominees-**All 9 members of the current board have agreed to serve next, but a couple of members would like to be replaced. As of today's meeting, no new board volunteers have shown interest.

## **CAF General Meeting**

October 12, 2017

<u>Call to Order</u>-President, David Sophusson, called the meeting to order at 10:10am. The minutes from the Sep. and Oct. meetings will be published in the Nov. edition of *The Riffle*. The Tuff Shed is in place and site preparation will be done for the new porta potti and holding tank. The updated Propagation Plan has been renewed for another 5 years by the STEP board. The STEP board approved the mini grant request for the chiller and associated parts for the Gold Beach High School salmon rearing project. John Weber made a power point presentation and answered questions at the meeting in Central Point.

**Treasurer-**Becky Sophusson reported a monthly loss of \$2,851.96 and a year to date loss of \$1,913.17. The major monthly expense was the final cost of the new equipment storage shed.

**Hatchery-**Gary Underhill reported: there are 14 pair of brood stock in the holding tank; raceway #3 liner is in place and will be finished before it's needed; the blocker dam is in place; the ladder has been cleaned.

**Ray's Market Receipts-**We need more members to enroll in the All Access Program. Members can enroll at the store using the CAF account #50642.

**<u>DVD-</u>**The board approved the purchase of a camera. Becky and David purchased a camera for \$40 and the wifi attachment for \$35.

<u>**Pizza Fundraiser-</u>**Barbara Jorge arranged for the fundraiser night on Nov. 1<sup>st</sup>. Fliers and tickets have been printed and are available.</u>

**Election/General Meeting-**The annual meeting will be on Dec. 9<sup>th</sup>. Barbara Huff and Becky Sophusson met with the new owners of HoneyBear and presented their findings to the board of directors. The board approved the selection of HoneyBear Restaurant and the details will be printed elsewhere in the newsletter. Members will pay for their meal and CAF will pay the gratuity. Tom Spani will be calling members for reservations, so please be courteous. **Board Member nominees-**All 9 members of the current board have agreed to serve next year, but a couple of members would prefer to retire. As of today's meeting, no new board volunteers have shown interest.

**Membership-**The members agreed that we should advertise the spawning activities at the visitor's center and in the happenings section of the newspapers. Introducing people to our activities is a stimulating exposure to gain new members. <u>Scholarships-</u>Jack Sheehan has resolved the details regarding the eligibility of home schooled students and they will be included this year.
